Every year, April is known as Volunteer Appreciation Month. When it comes to theatre, the old saying is true, it really does take a village to put on a show. Directors spend months in advance of their auditions getting ready. The actors spend months rehearsing a show. But what most people don't realize is how many people behind the scenes it truly takes to bring a show to life.

Let's take a simple small comedy as an example. A typical production staff might reflect a small cast of 4, a director, assistant director, lighting and sound designers, lighting and sound board operators, a stage manager, the stage crew usually of 4-5 people, 1-2 costumers, a props person, and a producer. That can be anywhere between 18-20 different people. These people work upwards to 3 months on a show before opening night. Typically, 3-4 nights a week averaging 3 hours a night. That alone is approximately 486-man hours dedicated in 3 months. But let's not forget the people that build and paint the sets. Here at SLT we have a small group of extremely dedicated retirees that come down to the building 2-3 days a week, during the day and usually work 3-4 hours a day, just building and painting sets and scenery. That's another 48 hours a week, more than a full-time job! It is very easy to say, for this small simple comedy that our loving volunteers easily put in 1062 hours over the course of 3 months.

Now, change that simple show into a musical, add a choreographer, musical director, larger casts, more people on stage crew and a band. SLT is extremely lucky to have a pool of band members that volunteer to provide live music for our shows. With a musical that small group of 18-20 can now become 40-45 different people. 1062 hours can easily be tripled if not more with longer rehearsals and more people. Wait, there's more! We haven't forgotten all the volunteers for the front of the house. The ones we see every time we enter the front doors and walk to our seats. There are the ushers, concessions, and box office volunteers that come to be the warm smiling face to greet you each and every show.

I can easily say that it can take anywhere between 4000-to-5000-man hours for each show we bring to the stage. We can't do it without you! A big THANK YOU to each and every volunteer!!! Without your love, dedication, and generosity it wouldn't be possible.

This year SLT held their first ever Member and Volunteer Appreciation event to thank all those for make SLT come to life. SLT appreciates all of those for who help from the front of


house to working backstage to working set design. WE THANK YOU ALL!
